CUB SCOUT DONOR AWARENESS AWARD

For a number of years, BSA has offered to Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts the Donor Awareness Patch shown above. It is worn on the right pocket of the uniform as a temporary insignia. BSA has reduced their emphasis on this program, but has not discontinued it completely. The patch is still being produced, but some Scout Shops™ may not routinely stock the patch. To avoid disappointing Scouts, CHECK FIRST to see if any are available in your area before promoting this program and patch.

Of course, promoting Donor Awareness is still a valid project for Scouts, and can be done, even without the opportunity to get this patch.

There are NO formal requirements for these patches. Each Unit establishes the procedure for awarding the patch. Pack 54 has decided to let the Parent/Guardian review the organ donor program with their son as they feel he can understand it. The Parent/Guardian will then report back to the boys Den Leader that this has been completed. The Den Leader will then add this to the boys Scout Record and it will be awarded at the next Pack Meeting.

Pack 54 will award only ONE patch to a boy while a member of the Pack.

This award is worn on the official uniform as a temporary patch on the right pocket. When another award is earned and is to be worn as a temporary patch, this one is moved to the red "brag vest".
